





Deeply incised drainage tributary to Ebabias Creek contributing high sediment loads to the watershed.




The project will help stabilize stream banks of Ebabias Creek.




The project will re-slope incised banks and revegetation will stabilize soil.



Riparian restoration will provide additional habitat adjacent to the Estero Americano estuary.









Hidden Springs Ranch: looking west towards existing wildlife corridor. Project will establish corridors to connect with existing habitat on east and west sides of the property.



Hidden Springs Ranch: invasive pampas grass in existing wildlife corridor will be replaced with native vegetation.






Live Earth Farm: hedgerow will be established adjacent to orchard and will connect corridors to add wildlife value and beneficial insects (for pollination) to property.




































Pit River weir, the only way to flood the floodplain, is falling apart and needs replacing.



The dredged river channel is deeply incised, essentially eliminating natural floodplain function.




Existing wet meadow and pasture provide habitat for a wide range of wetland species, while providing forage for cattle on a working ranch.























Looking east/northeast, this area of levee is proposed to be lowered, and the fill will be used to construct ditch blocks.




















