ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Hunters must possess a valid 2018-2019 California hunting license and upland game bird stamp. Hunters possessing a junior hunting license do not need an upland game bird stamp and must be accompanied by a non-shooting adult 18 years of age or older. All shooters and non-shooters must wear shooting safety glasses, blaze orange, and initial and sign the enclosed waiver.

Please come prepared and wear appropriate gear for the hunt; we strongly recommend you bring water, snacks, a hat, sturdy shoes/boots, sweater/jacket, eye protection, mosquito repellant and a cooler with ice for your birds. For safety, Apprentice hunters must have a properly fitted shotgun. Please note if you are not prepared for the hunt or your gear is deemed unsafe you may be asked to withdraw from the hunt.

The Upland Game Bird Special Hunts Program is pleased to offer you this special hunt. Practice good sportsmanship, enjoy your hunt and most of all, be a safe hunter. If you require any special accommodations, cannot attend this hunt, or have any questions please contact the Department of Fish and Wildlife at (805)237-9288 between the hours of 9:00 a.m and 5:00 p.m.

- Effective July 1, 2016, non-lead shot will be required when taking upland game birds with a shotgun, except for dove, quail, snipe, and any game birds taken on licensed game bird clubs.
- Effective July 1, 2015, NON-LEAD AMMUNITION will be required when hunting on ALL CDFW Lands.

If you will not be able to attend on the date you have been assigned, please call (805)610-3920 so your spot can be given to one of the youth hunters on our waiting list. Please have your attached liability waiver completed when you arrive for the hunt. Please remember you must possess a current 2018-19 Junior Hunting License to participate.

The hunt will be held at Lazy Arrow Outdoor Adventures on the Camatta Ranch run by the Morrison Family right on Highway 58. From the south the location is about 25 miles from Santa Margarita and from the north the location is about 25 miles from Paso Robles. Please plan on at least a 30 minute drive from Santa Margarita or Paso Robles (Directions Attached). Our program starts at 7:30 a.m. and runs until 3:00 p.m. All participants and their families will be provided a free barbeque lunch.

You should bring the following items:

1. 2018/2019 Junior Hunting License (mandatory)

- 2. shotgun
- 3. signed liability waiver (attached)
- 4. ice chest with ice to transport birds
- 5. camera (if available)
- 6. warm clothing, good footwear
- 7. eye protection

All participants will register starting at 7:00 a.m. During the registration junior hunters will be assigned to a group. The group rotates together through our various educational seminars. In past years classes have been provided such as fisheries and wildlife management, wildlife enforcement, shooting skills, black powder and game care. All youth hunters will participate in a field hunt with guides and trained hunting dogs where each participant will have the opportunity to take two cock pheasant. No parents are allowed in the field. Parents may view participants from identified viewing locations.



The Ten Commandments of Firearms Safety:

- 1. Watch that muzzle! Keep it pointed in a safe direction at all times.
 - 2. Treat every firearm with the respect due a loaded gun.
- 3. Be sure of your target and what is in front of it and beyond it.
- 4. Keep your finger outside the trigger guard until ready to shoot .
 - 5. Check your barrel and ammunition.
 - 6. Unload firearms when not in use.
 - 7. Point your firearm only at something you intend to shoot.
 - 8. Don't run, jump, or climb with a loaded firearm.
 - 9. Store firearms and ammunition separately and safely.
- 10. Don't drink alcohol, use drugs or take medications that might impair your abilities and good judgment before or while handling firearms or archery equipment.



Appendix 1 – Hunt site location



Driving Hwy 101 from the south: Take Hwy 101 north to the town of Santa Margarita, approximately 8.5 miles north of San Luis Obispo. Take exit 211 onto Hwy 58. Go approximately 1.5 miles, through town, then turn right to stay on Hwy 58. Watch the signs - Hwy 58 turns left after you leave town. Follow Hwy 58 for approximately 22 miles. (You will pass intersections with Hwy 229 to Creston, La Panza Road and Shell Creek Road on the way out.) Turn left on Camatta Creek Road. Plan on about a one hour drive from San Luis Obispo.

Driving Hwy 101 from the north: Take Hwy 101 south to Atascadero, approximately 10 miles south of Paso Robles. Take exit 219. Turn left onto Hwy 41 East. Go through town and continue on Hwy 41 for approximately 10 miles. Pass the turn off for Creston (Hwy 229), go over the Huerhuero Creek and turn right onto La Panza Road. Go for approximately 10 miles. At the stop sign, turn left onto Hwy 58. Go approximately 6 miles. Turn left on Camatta Creek Road. Plan on about a one hour drive from Paso Robles.

Driving Hwy 58 from the east (Carrizo Plains/Soda Lake Road): Follow Hwy 58 west approximately 20 miles past Soda Lake Road in the Carrizo Plains. Turn right onto Camatta Creek Road. Plan on about a 30 minute drive from Soda Lake Road.

Waiver And Release Of Claims: I hereby expressly waive any right that the Child might have to sue the State, in agents, employees and/or volunteers for any physical or emotional injuries, illnesses, death or other damages that the Child might suffer as a result of participating in hunting activities on State property.
5. Waiver And Release Of Claims Based On Negligence: In addition to the inherent dangers involved in hunting or State property described above, I further acknowledge that serious injuries or death may be caused by the negligent acts of State employees, its agents, volunteers or other persons which increase the risk of injury beyond those normally anticipated while hunting. I hereby expressly agree that the Child assumes the risk that the Child may be seriously injured or killed through the negligent acts of others. I agree to waive any right the Child may have to sue the State, its agents, employees and/or volunteers for injuries or death that the Child may suffer arising out of participating in hunting or related activities including physical or emotional injuries, illnesses or death caused by the negligent acts of the State, its agents, employees, volunteers or other persons.
Prior to executing this waiver and release of liability, I was given the opportunity to thoroughly read the entire document and to consult my own legal counsel regarding the potential effect of signing this agreement. I hereby consent to be bound by its terms and conditions and consent to the Child being bound by its terms and conditions.
