### **Summary of Previous/Future Actions**

 Today consider approving proposed rulemaking timetable Feb 6, 2019; Sacramento

## **Background**

FGC maintains a perpetual timetable for anticipated regulatory actions. At each FGC meeting, staff provides the latest approved timetable along with requests for changes from FGC staff and/or DFW (Exhibit 1), highlighted in bolded and underlined blue text (Exhibit 2).

DFW makes the following requests:

- Add a rulemaking to amend Section 180.6 to clarify the number of hagfish traps permitted on a single vessel. The proposed schedule is to have a notice hearing at the Apr 2019 meeting, and discussion/adoption at the Jun 2019 meeting.
- Add a rulemaking to amend sections 550, 550.5, 551 and 630 related to public use on DFW lands to designate up to nine properties, remove designations for up to four properties, clarify regulatory language, and propose targeted site-specific changes supported by a management plan or environmental document to address operational needs or to address public safety concerns that have come to DFW's attention. The proposed schedule is to have a notice hearing at the Oct 2019 meeting, discussion at the Dec 2019 meeting, and adoption at the Feb 2020 meeting.
- Delay the rulemaking for implementing regulations for the Herring Fishery Management Plan to add Section 28.62 and amend sections 27.60, 28.60, 163, 163.1, 163.5, and 164. The delay is to allow time to adequately address recommendations from the independent scientific review panel in the FMP,including addition of new environmental indicators into the management strategy. The revised schedule is proposed as a notice hearing at the Jun 2019 meeting, discussion in Aug 2019, and adoption at the Oct 2019 meeting.
- Remove the rulemaking for possible amendments to the upland (resident) game bird (2019) regulation review for Section 300. Details explaining the reason for removing this rulemaking appear under Agenda Item 14.

Subject: Request for Changes to the Fish and Game Commission's Timetable for Anticipated Regulatory Actions

The Department of Fish and Wildlife (Department) requests the following schedule changes to the Fish and Game Commission's (Commission's) 2019 regulatory timetable:

- Add a rulemaking to amend Section 180.6 to clarify the number of hagfish traps permitted on a single vessel. Current language allows for 25 barrel traps per permittee; the amended regulation would make it clear that a maximum of 25 traps may be possessed aboard a single vessel, regardless of the number of permittees on board.
  - The proposed meeting schedule is notice at the April 2019, and discussion/adoption at the June 2019 meeting.
- Add a rulemaking to amend Sections 550, 550.5, 551 and 630 to designate up
  to nine properties, un-designate up to four properties, clarify regulatory
  language and propose targeted site-specific changes supported by a
  management plan or environmental document, to address operational needs,
  or to address public safety concerns that have come to the Department's
  attention.
  - The proposed meeting schedule is notice at the October 2019 meeting, discussion at the December 2019 meeting, and adoption at the February 2020 meeting.
- Delay receipt of the Herring Fishery Management Plan.
  - The revised meeting schedule will be receipt of the FMP in June 2019, discussion at the August 2019 meeting, and adoption at the October 2019 meeting.

- Delay the rulemaking for implementing regulations for the Herring Fishery Management Plan to add Section 28.62 and amend Sections 27.60, 28.60, 163, 163.1, 163.5, and 164.
  - The revised meeting schedule is notice at the June 2019 meeting, discussion at the August 2019, and adoption at the October 2019 meeting.
- Remove the rulemaking for possible amendments to the Upland (Resident)
   Game Bird annual (2019) regulation review for Section 300.
  - The revised meeting schedule is to remove the notice at the February 2019 meeting, discussion at the April 2019, and adoption at the June 2019 meeting.
