NSO Interagency Working Group (gov. agency only)

NSOIWG is a government agency group addressing all topics related to spotted owl.

- Product- and decision-based group
- Addresses policy/regulation topics as they arise
- Aims to provide consistency among agencies, where feasible
- Addresses outreach and education items
- Plans agency trainings

Barred Owl Science Team (subject matter scientists)

BOST is a barred owl research focused group working to promote NSO recovery in California

- Developed following CDFW guidance for Ad Hoc Science Advisory Teams
- Covers both NSO and CSO
- Reviews research proposals
- Develops standard methodologies
- Identifies research needs
- Devises large-scale regional experimental removal study for California.

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Northern Spotted Owl Interagency Working Group (NSOIWG)

The Northern Spotted Owl Interagency Working Group (NSOIWG) was officially established in 2016. The group first met as a response to public concerns related to Northern Spotted Owl on private timberland. Staff of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS), California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW), and California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CALFIRE) are members of the group and meet regularly throughout the year. The goal of the NSOIWG is to promote recovery of the Northern Spotted Owl in California by facilitating interagency understanding and communications.

- the Spotted Owl Observations Database
- agency roles
- post-fire issues
- training needs
- current science
- management and regulatory challenges
- outreach

Survey Protocol

The US Fish and Wildlife Service created a consistent survey protocol for Northern Spotted Owls in 1992, revised in 2012. This survey protocol provides a scientifically vetted method for locating owls prior to management activities.
