AS IT STOOD (MRC - NOV 2018)

- COMMERCIAL OFFSHORE MARINE FINFISH AQUACULTURE
 IS NOT CURRENTLY PRACTICED IN CALIFORNIA.
- IT IS PROHIBITED IN STATE MARINE WATERS WITHOUT A LEASE FROM FISH & GAME COMMISSION.
- BEFORE A LEASE CAN BE ISSUED, A REGULATORY FRAMEWORK
 GOVERNING THE ACTIVITY MUST BE PUT INTO PLACE.
- CERTAIN CONCERNS EXPRESSED BY LEGISLATURE ("SB201 FACTORS"),
 - DIRECTS FGC TO CONSIDER HOW IT WILL ADDRESS IN NEW REGULATORY FRAMEWORK – ANALYZED THROUGH PEIR.
