









Banks along the creek channel at the Knoxville townsite will be revegetated with native riparian plants.




Isolated infestations of barbed goatgrass will be eradicated in the watershed.































































(5) Picnic Area - A riparian forested picnic area provides a natural space for visitors to eat and rest. (6) Adamson House Wall - A wall reflecting the aesthetic design of the Adamson House wall acts as an interpretive surface to illuminate the rich cultural history of the site.












