A. Implementation of AB 1112

- ♦ Comply with requirements of AB 1112; implement comprehensive risk-based bunkering and lightering monitoring program effective July 1, 2012
- Complete regulatory process for Nontank fee increase to \$3,250.
- Joint Legislative Audit Committee- requires audit by Bureau of State Audits- started
 December 2011 estimated 5 month project (see scope of audit and objectives)
- Department of Finance audit- expected to start in June 2012; mandated every four years by AB 1112; OSPR and State Lands Comm.

B. Reduce risk of bunkering spills

- Drills/training for bunkering companies; required to deploy 600' boom in 30 minutes and another 600' in next 30 minutes
- ♦ Developing New Pacific States/British Columbia Oil Spill Task Force bunkering best practices video based on Washington State video
- Face to face meeting between Persons in Charge before transfers
- Other Best Maritime Practices as identified by Harbor Safety Committees

C. Improve response readiness

 OSPR personnel- Incident Command System training; Personal Qualification Standards

- Spill management teams- need to meet Best Achievable Protection standard notifications; first 6-12 hours; full spill management teams; Based on observations during drills believe major oil companies' nationwide teams already provide for BAP.
- Mutual aid- States must be pro-active; cascading equipment requires approval of federal government, State and plan holders; Pacific States/BC signed new mutual aid agreement in August 2011.

D. Funding:

- Oiled Wildlife Care Network funding OSRTF; or OSPAF; OSRTF interest good through FY 2012-13. Need to intensify funding source for FY 2013/14 and beyond.
- Fund 207- Identify sustainable funding for Inland spill response program reduced from 17- 10.5 PY's in FY 2011/12. Fund will be exhausted by end of FY 2012/13.
