



## California Department of Fish and Wildlife Drought Response Implementation Plan (DRIP) Grant Program

## **Notice of Intent to Award**

August 22, 2014

The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) announces its intent to award three payable grant projects that respond to the Governor's <u>April 2014 Drought</u> <u>Proclamation</u>.

These CDFW funded projects will address the effects of extreme drought conditions on Chinook Salmon, currently listed as endangered under both the federal Endangered Species Act (ESA) and the California Endangered Species Act (CESA).

Specifically, these projects will increase the collection of needed broodstock Chinook Salmon during extreme drought conditions, and will also increase passage for salmon to more favorable habitat conditions via fish ladders.

The following table identifies each grant project proposed for award. Funding of these projects is contingent upon approval of the Director and execution of a grant agreement.
