# **Background**

The natural resource Trustees were awarded \$22.7 million to implement 14 restoration projects. The funds come from the Oil Spill Liability Trust Fund managed by the US Coast Guard. The projects are intended to compensate for injuries caused by oil leaks from the *S.S. Jacob Luckenbach*, a vessel that sank off the coast of San Francisco in 1953. Most of the projects are underway.



# **Restoration Project Highlights**

# **Dune Habitat Restoration at Point Reyes National Seashore**

Luckenbach funds contributed to a 250-acre project. In summer 2014, there were 14 Snowy Plover nests in the restored area. Nine of the nests hatched eggs and six chicks were fledged. At right, three plover eggs sit inside a clump of Tidestrom's Lupine. Both the bird and the plant are endangered species.




### **Seabird Protection Network**



In summer 2014, Common Murre productivity was 0.87 chicks per pair at Castle-Hurricane Pt and 0.82 at Devil's Slide Rock, marking an excellent year with lots of prey fish offshore and limited disturbance at the colonies. These are some of the most productive years ever documented at these colonies. Plane and helicopter disturbance at Devil's Slide remains a source of concern, but incidents have declined from past years.

# The revegetation of the central plateau at Año Nuevo Island is complete and is sustaining the Rhinoceros Auklet colony. The continued existence of the colony was threatened due to severe soil erosion. Results show that, not only has the colony been preserved, but it is now thriving and slightly increasing with the native plant cover.
