* Chairman Flores participated by telephone from his office at the State Capitol, Governor's Office, Sacramento, California. Ms. Lipphardt and Ms. Rivera participated by telephone from the Wildlife Conservation Board offices at 1807 13th Street, Sacramento, California.

Mr. Wright reported that the purpose of this meeting was to consider a fund shift of the following projects shown below in 2a. so that these projects may be funded from Prop 12 and Prop 40 funds instead of the General Fund, as proposed and originally approved by the Board. Referring to the projects shown below in 2c., Mr. Wright reported that these projects were completed and the remaining funds would be recovered and returned to the General Fund. Ms. Lipphardt clarified that there were also two amounts shown below in 2b. that were never allocated and that the Board is also requesting those amounts be released to the General Fund.

- 2. The Department of Finance issued Budget Letter 02-40 directing State Agencies, Departments, Boards and Commissions to take immediate action to generate General Fund savings for the current year budget. The Wildlife Conservation Board has identified contracts and/or grants that can be funded with alternative funds, unallocated amounts that can be reverted and unexpended project balances that can be recovered to the General Fund as shown below.
 - a. The following chart lists a variety of Board approved projects that are in various stages of completion. This proposal is to shift funds from the General Fund to the Safe Neighborhood Parks, Clean Water, Clean Air and Coastal Protection Bond Fund (5096.350), also called Proposition 12 funds or the California Clean Water, Clean Air, Safe Neighborhood Parks and Coastal Protection Bond Fund (5096.650), also called Proposition 40 funds, as shown in the chart below:
