Pursuant to Section 125(e)(3), Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations, not more than five (5) Southern Rock Crab Trap Permits (SRCTP) shall be transferred by the Department of Fish and Wildlife during each permit year (April 1-March 31). Applications shall be processed in the order received in a permit year. Applicants and transfer fees received after the annual limit of five permit transfers has been reached, shall be returned to the applicants. Applicants may resubmit their application on or after the first day of the following permit year for consideration. If any given day, the number of applications received is greater than the number of available transfers, the Department shall conduct a manual drawing to determine which application(s) shall be processed.

Southern Rock Crab Trap Permit Transfer Requirements

Please submit the following to the Department's License and Revenue Branch:

- Transfer application in the form of a notarized letter which identifies the transferee.
- Original current permit holder's SRCTP.
- Copy of transferee's valid California Commercial Fishing License.
- Copy of the transferee's valid Trap Permit.
- Nonrefundable transfer fee of \$1,000.

Death of Permittee

In the event of the death of the permit holder, the estate of the holder of a Southern Rock Crab Trap Permit (SRCTP) may renew the permit if needed to keep it valid. The estate of the decedent may transfer the SRCTP no later than two years from the date of death pursuant to Section 125e(4), Title 14 of the CCR.
