Dear Jesse:

On January 29, 2009, I was notified by USFWS that several California Condors were on Newhall Land property, as detected by the GPS units worn by the condors. They had been on the ranch for several consecutive days that week, which strongly suggested that they were feeding on a carcass.

On January 30, I was notified by Newhall Land and asked to search for the condors and the carcass. At 1345, I located a cow carcass near the condor GPS points. (Carcass position: 34.39814, -118.65232). It was in lower Potrero Canyon just up canyon from the corrals. The carcass was in a flat open field surrounded by open grassy hills, on which the condors had been perched. The carcass had been picked clean to the bone. There were condor feathers on the ground at the carcass. The condors that had been at the carcass were no longer in the immediate area or on Newhall property, as determined by radio telemetry. While on Newhall property I also scanned for non-GPS condors, but none where detected.
