APPLYING TO TRANSFER A SEA CUCUMBER PERMIT

In addition to the transfer letter, the following items must be submitted with the transfer request:

- Letter with permit holder’s original signature must be notarized.
- Letter of verification that the current permit holder has landed at least 100 pounds of sea cucumbers in any four permit years from the Department’s Marine Fisheries Statistical Unit.
- The permit holder’s original valid Sea Cucumber Permit.
- Copy of the proposed permit holder’s valid California Commercial Fishing License.
- Nonrefundable transfer fee of \$200.00.
