

## **Notice of Intent to Adopt a Mitigated Negative Declaration for the PG&E Gas Line 107 Retirement and Line 131 Valve Replacement Project**

The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) is publishing a Mitigated Negative Declaration and supporting Initial Study (IS/MND) for Pacific Gas and Electric Company's (PG&E) application to retire a 13-mile portion of gas transmission pipeline 107 (L-107). A previously abandoned section of pipeline 131 (L-131) would be removed from a property where a section of L-107 is being removed. PG&E would also conduct valve repairs and replacements at two locations on L-131, which runs parallel to L-107 in Alameda County. The L-107 runs from south of Livermore to the eastern border of Fremont, California. The L-107 runs through public and private lands and contains 58 locations where ground-disturbing activities would take place to either remove the pipeline or abandon it in place.

The total area of suitable upland habitat for California tiger salamander and California red-legged frog that would be temporarily or permanently disturbed is approximately a total of 10.26 acres.

Based on the Draft IS/MND, it has been determined that the proposed project would not have any significant effects on the environment with incorporation of the mitigation identified in the IS/MND. CDFW's environmental document may be reviewed at the following locations during the following hours:
