Work, 34 hours for cleaning/enlarging willow basins  
32 hours receiving/unloading and building of the brushpiles.  
Balance of manager labor is watering 14 hours on weekends from 4-15-98 to 11-15-98 - (Volunteer labor) F.R.K.

Vallécito Inmates, 136 hours labor, brushpile construction.

All work on contract took place from 11-15-97 to 2-6-98.

Benefits, Blackbass, Crappie, Sunfish, Amphibians and fry of adults obtain food, cover and increased survival rates March--September. (high water)

Snakes, Quail, Songbirds, Jack & Cottontail rabbits find food, cover and nesting during low water levels. June-December

\* The size and location of the present worksite will take a minimum of three years work to complete, due to the amount of trees needed to properly restore backwater areas.
