



## Proposition 1 Application Workshops

The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) will conduct two online application workshops to assist applicants in understanding the process for submitting proposals in response to the Fiscal Year (FY) 2017-18 Proposal Solicitation Notice (Solicitation) for its Proposition 1 Restoration Grant Programs. These workshops are optional and not required as part of the grant program. Both sessions will be recorded and later posted online with the presentation. The first session will include guidance for developing a monitoring plan, incorporating Wetland and Riparian Area Monitoring Plan (WRAMP) tools, and identifying public databases for project data.
