Invasive species are plants, animals, and microorganisms that are not native to an environment, and once introduced, they can cause harm to the environment, the economy, or humans. Invasive species are introduced by a variety of ways, including commercial shipping, release from pet and aquarium owners, or by attaching to boats, boots, animals or even clothing.

Examples include: a written pledge to not release your pet, a public service announcement or video explaining the risk of a particular species, or instructions for cleaning your boots, boat, or gear. THEME: Pledge to Not Spread!

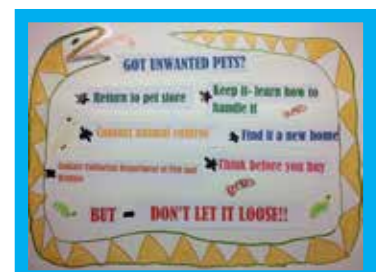
