# NON-LEAD IMPLEMENTATION

**Objective: Provide update on recent legislative and ballot initiative addressing ammunition**

- Proposition 63: Safety for All Act of 2016**
- Senate Bill 1235 (DeLeon)**



# PROPOSITION 63

## Main Elements:

- Background checks for ammunition
- Ammunition sales
- Large-capacity ammunition magazines
- Lost or stolen firearms or ammunition
- Firearm possession
- Department of Justice provisions



# PROPOSITION 63

## Ammunition Provisions:

- Buying ammunition
  - Requires 4-year permit from DOJ
  - Establishes permit fee – not to exceed \$50
- Selling ammunition
  - Requires 1-year license from DOJ
  - Establishes penalties for non-compliance
- Other requirements
  - Requires out-of-state purchases be shipped to licensed vendor
  - Establishes penalties for non-compliance



# PROPOSITION 63

## Timeline:

- ❑ January 1, 2018 –
  - Ammunition sales and transfers must be conducted through a licensed vendor
  - Ammunitions being brought into state must be shipped to licensed vendor
  
- ❑ January 1, 2019
  - Background check required to buy ammunition



# SENATE BILL 1235

## Main Elements:

- Amendments to Proposition 63, if passed by voters
- Provisions for ammunition purchases, if Proposition 63 not passed by voters



# SENATE BILL 1235

## Provisions Enacted:

- Sell of ammunition
  - Current certificate of eligibility from DOJ  
or
  - Purchase or transfer in single transaction, as specified
  
- Fees
  - Per transaction fee not to exceed \$1
  - Deposits funds into Ammunition Safety and Enforcement Special Fund
