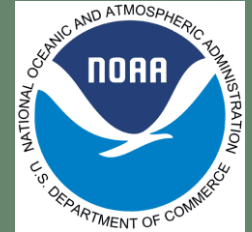

PSN Part III – Funding Programs

- Two Funding Programs in the 2019 PSN
 - Fisheries Restoration Grant Program (FRGP)
 - Forest Land Anadromous Restoration (FLAR)



Fisheries Restoration Grant Program (FRGP)

- Projects that restore, enhance, or protect anadromous salmonid habitat in watersheds of California or projects that lead to process-based restoration, enhancement, or protection of anadromous salmonid habitat.
- Anticipated \$14 million, no project maximum
- Geographic area covered by the FRGP Funding Program:
 - Southern California/South-Central Steelhead;
 - Central California Coast (CCC) Coho Salmon, Steelhead, and coastal Chinook Salmon;
 - Northern California Steelhead, Coho Salmon, and coastal Chinook Salmon; and
 - Central Valley.



Forest Land Anadromous Restoration (FLAR)

- Provide funds to be used on forested watersheds to restore conditions beneficial to State and/or federally listed anadromous salmonids.
- Restoration projects may be implemented as a part of timber harvesting plans and other such types of projects subject to the Z'Berg-Nejedly Forest Practice Act and the California Forest Practice Rules.
- Anticipated up to \$2 million.
- Project terms may not exceed two years.



Updates from 2018

- The PSN Organization
 - 2018 FHR Part II and Part IV were combined into Part II.
 - Project Type Requirements is now Part IV and Definitions is now Part V.
 - Project Type Requirements were reformatted to make them clearer and guide applicants to terms that have specific definitions, e.g. Evaluation Plan (see definition in Part V).
- Steelhead Report and Restoration Card (SHHRC) and Commercial Salmon Stamp (CSS) are not included in this solicitation.
- The “Focuses” are referred to as Funding Programs, i.e. FRGP and FLAR.



Updates from 2018

- Project Type Updates
 - Project Type descriptions were reformatted to improve clarity.
 - HI Project Type was updated to clearly explain the allowable instream activities.
 - WC Project Type was updated to allow for small water conservation projects.



Updates from 2018

- Performance Measures
 - Performance Measures are not required for the Application.
 - However, all Awarded Grants will be required to input Performance Measures in to WebGrants upon grant execution. Please budget appropriately.
 - A list of Performance Measures can be found in Appendix B.



Updates from 2018

- Project Budget

- Applicants will submit a complete Detailed Project Budget Spreadsheet (Excel) as Supplemental Documents and will only have to input lump sums for budget categories in WebGrants.

Clarifications from 2018

- **Cultural Resources Surveys are the responsibility of the Grantee, please budget appropriately.** (Part V: Environmental Compliance and Appendix B)
 - “Eligible proposed projects will avoid significant environmental impacts. **Applicants should budget sufficient time and/or funds in the proposal to complete required threatened and endangered species surveys, biological monitoring, and required reasonable measures that are protective and avoid causing harm to cultural, archeological, paleontological and biological resources, including native species and their habitat.** For more information on surveys, monitoring, and protective measures that a project funded through this PSN may need to complete, see the Mitigated Negative Declaration for the 2018 Fisheries Habitat Restoration Project at <https://www.wildlife.ca.gov/Grants/FRGP/MNDSTe>.”



Clarification from 2018

- Indirect Charges are not suitable for use as cost share.
- Permit Requirements (Appendix F) is mandatory for projects with temporary and/or permanent resource impacts. Impact calculation instructions in Appendix F.
- There is a PSN FAQ
