The removal of invasive plants helps with native habitat restoration and preservation of ecosystems. The group is also involved in locating and collecting data about non-native species. The park has a goal to be weed free, so this is a great opportunity to assist park staff with restoration efforts. The work involves being and stooping in native habitat. Participants should wear sturdy shoes/boots, long sleeve shirts, long pants, a hat, and sunscreen. The work can be hot and a water bottle is highly recommended. Gloves, weeding tools, and bags will be supplied. Knowledge of native and invasive plans is helpful but not necessary. Skills on plant identification and proper removal techniques will be taught.
