San Diego County MPA Collaborative

Created in 2012, the San Diego County Marine Protected Area (MPA) Collaborative has supported local MPAs with talent and dedication. Members have led efforts to install local interpretive and regulatory MPA signs as well as distributing recreational brochures and fishing guides that also integrate Kumeyaay tribal practices and history into the resources.

Recently, the San Diego County MPA Collaborative joined with WildCoast to help the California Wildlife Officers Foundation host a "Wags & Waves" event to honor and highlight enforcement efforts of California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) wildlife officers. They also designed and released a brand new wildlife and recreation guide providing an overview of local MPAs accompanied by beautiful illustrations of marine species commonly found off the San Diego coast.

Currently co-chaired by Zach Plopper of WildCoast and Isabelle Kay of UC San Diego Natural Reserve System, the San Diego County MPA Collaborative is comprised of members from over 40 organizations including city, state, and federal government agencies, non-profits, citizen scientists, tribes, commercial and recreational fishermen, and universities. "It's an honor to work with such a diverse and experienced group of individuals," commented Plopper. "It really shows that MPAs are a priority for this region."
