IMPORTANT INFORMATION: YOUR 2021 HERRING PERMIT RENEWAL IS LISTED ON YOUR ENCLOSED 2021 COMMERCIAL FISHING LICENSE RENEWAL WORKSHEET

Due to the temporary closure of license sales offices to the public to help slow the spread of COVID-19, the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) is asking all customers who are not renewing their licenses online to please mail their renewal worksheets and any additional required documents directly to the address below to streamline the issuance of 2021 Commercial Fishing Licenses, Commercial Boat Registrations, and Limited Entry and Restricted Access Permits.

NEW DEADLINE TO RENEW PACIFIC HERRING PERMITS

Commercial Herring Permit Renewals must be received or postmarked by April 30, 2021. Commercial Herring Permit Renewals received or postmarked after April 30, 2021, must be accompanied by a late fee.

MANDATORY VESSEL DESIGNATION FOR 2021 HERRING RENEWALS

Permittees must designate a currently registered vessel on the Commercial Fishing License Renewal Worksheet. Up to two temporary permits or one permit of any other classification of herring permit may be assigned to a currently registered vessel. No herring permit shall be valid for more than one vessel at a time.

APPLICATIONS FOR HERRING PERMITS AND HERRING EGGS ON KELP (HOEK) PERMITS

The California Pacific Herring Fishery Management Plan (Herring FMP) recently adjusted permit numbers to help sustain healthy

herring populations. If the number of Herring Permits and HEOK Permits issued is less than the permit numbers established in the Herring FMP for the immediately preceding permit year (ending March 31), CDFW will accept applications for the available permits and issue them through a random selection computer-generated drawing. The permit numbers established in the Herring FMP are as follows:

- San Francisco Bay Herring Permits: 30
- Tomales Bay Herring Permits:15
- Humboldt Bay Herring Permits: 4
- Crescent City Herring Permits: 3
- HEOK Permits:10

Applications for new Herring Permits and HEOK Permits will be made available each year on April 15 at CDFW License Sales Offices, CDFW's Online License Sales and Services web page, and at license agents authorized to renew existing commercial fishing licenses. Please contact your local office to determine if it has reopened to the public prior to planning a visit.

Applicants must apply by May 31, possess a valid Commercial Fishing License, and pay a nonrefundable drawing fee. Applicants for new Herring Permits and HEOK Permits cannot possess a permit of the same classification at the time of application or submit more than one application for the same license year.

Successful applicants will be notified within 20 business days following May 31, and must submit a Commercial Herring Permit Worksheet and/or HEOK Permit Application to the CDFW address listed above by July 15 with the required permit fee as specified in California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Section 705 (a). Herring Permits and HEOK Permit fees for the 2021-2022 license year are \$421.25 for residents and \$1,547.00 for non-residents.
