## Meeting Outcomes for June 16-17, 2021

The Commission approved the agenda, continued item 16 to a future meeting, and moved item 28 to the end of the first day.

3. Five-year private lands wildlife habitat enhancement and management (PLM) plans Consider approving five-year PLM plans and 2021-2025 licenses for six properties. (Pursuant to Section 601, Title 14, CCR)

The Commission approved the five-year plans.

4. Annual PLM plans

Consider approving annual PLM plans and 2021/2022 licenses for 37 properties. (Pursuant to Section 601, Title 14, CCR)

6. Western Joshua Tree

Consider approving the Department's request for a six-month extension to deliver the one-year status review report on the petition to list western Joshua tree (*Yucca brevifolia*) as a threatened or endangered species under the California Endangered Species Act (CESA). (Pursuant to Section 2074.6, Fish and Game Code)

The Commission approved a six-month extension.

# 28. Chinook salmon in anadromous waters of the Klamath River Basin downstream of Iron Gate and Lewiston dams

If the Commission determines that listing upper Klamath-Trinity river spring Chinook salmon (*Oncorhynchus tshawytscha*) as a threatened or endangered species under CESA *is not warranted*, consider authorizing publication of notice of intent to continue the Klamath River Basin spring Chinook salmon special regulations. (Amend subsection 7.40(b)(50) and repeal subsection 7.40(b)(51), Title 14, CCR)

The Commission added to the August 18-19, 2021 Commission meeting agenda an item to consider authorizing notice to amend the regulations.
