Please come prepared and wear appropriate gear for the hunt; we strongly recommend you bring

water, a hat, sturdy shoes/boots, sweater/jacket, mosquito repellant and a cooler with ice for

your birds. For safety, Apprentice hunters must have a properly fitted shotgun. Please note if

you are not prepared for the hunt or your gear is deemed unsafe you may be asked to withdraw

from the hunt.

The Ten Commandments of Firearms Safety

- 1. Watch that muzzle! Keep it pointed in a safe direction at all times.
- 2. Treat every firearm with the respect due a loaded gun.
- 3. Be sure of your target and what is in front of it and beyond it.
- 4. Keep your finger outside the trigger guard until ready to shoot.
- 5. Check your barrel and ammunition.
- 6. Unload firearms when not in use.
- 7. Point your firearm only at something you intend to shoot.
- 8. Don't run, jump, or climb with a loaded firearm.
- 9. Store firearms and ammunition separately and safely.
- 10. Don't drink alcohol, use drugs or take medications that might impair your abilities and good judgement before or while handling firearms or archery equipment.
