Public Notice of Intent to Issue a Permit for Mountain Lion Research in California

Legislation passed in 2012 requires the Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) to notify the public at least 30 days prior to the issuance of a Scientific Collecting Permit (SCP) to qualified researchers desiring to conduct research on mountain lions.

The legislation is described in Section 4810 of the Fish and Game Code, and Title 14, Section 650(e)(3)(C) of the California Code of Regulations.

Executive Summary:

Mountain Lion Biopsy Dart Project

The mountain lion program within CDFW has initiated a state-wide mountain lion project which, among other objectives, seeks to understand state-wide mountain lion population genetics and non-invasive methods for estimating mountain lion abundance. The mountain lion program coordinator for CDFW has developed and begun to implement a contract with a geneticist to aid in analyzing genetic samples from mountain lions across California. However, to better meet objectives of the state-wide mountain lion project, CDFW requires 1) additional mountain lion genetic samples from poorly-sampled regions across the state as well as 2) genetic samples from focal areas for genetic population estimation techniques. The United States Department of Agriculture – Wildlife Services (USDA-WS) agency will directly support CDFW's efforts in gathering genetic samples from mountain lions across California for these dual purposes.
