NORTHERN PINK SHRIMP TRAWL VESSEL PERMIT TRANSFER APPLICATION

GENERAL PROVISIONS

Effective Poril 1, 2001, pursuant to Section 120.2(e) of Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations (CCR), Norther Pink Shrimp Trawl Vesse Permits (NPSTVP) are transferable subject to the following conditions.

- A transferable NPSTVP may not be transferred more than once every 12 months.
- A transferable NPSTVP may be transferred any number of times to a different vessel up to five (5) feet greater in overall length than the original length endorsement, or of equal or less overall length.
- The original length endorsement will remain on the permit.

NORTHERN PINK SHRIMP TRAWL VESSEL PERMIT TRANSFER PROVISIONS

Transfer to a Replacement Vessel Owned by the Same Permittee

NPST (Ps may be transferred to a replacement vessel owned by the permittee within two years of the permitted vessel being lost, stolen, or destroyed.

Any norther pink shrimp trawl vessel may be permanently retired from the fishery for any reason.

The owner of the replacement vessel must submit a marine survey for the replacement vessel completed by a certified marine surveyor on or after April 1, 1991, that shows the overall length of the replacement vessel. The owner may also submit as documentation a copy of their current valid Federal Groundfish Permit that shows the endorsed length. (Section 120.2(c)(3), Title 14, CCR).

Instructions for Transfer to a Replacement Vessel Owned by the Same Permittee (Fee \$200)

Submit copies of the following:

- Current Fish and Gane Commercial Boat Registration for permitted vessel.
- 2. Current Fish and Game Commercial Boat Registration for replacement vessel.
- U.S. Coast Guard Documentation for the replacement vessel or proof of ownership.

Note: If the vessel is no longer available for measurement and does not have a current valid Federal Group rish Permit, the Department may consider one of the following:

- a) a marine survey dated prior April 1, 1999;
- b) US Coast Guard Documentation; or
- c) Proof of ownership registration it cords.

Instructions for Temporary Transfer (Fee 100) (valid for up to one year)

Any NPSTVP may be temporarily transferred, for up to one year, to a different commercial figuring vessel, if the permitted vessel is seriously damaged, has suffered a major mechanical breakdown, or is lost or destroyed. The request for temporary transfer must include documentation to substantiate the damage, breakdown, loss or destruction. (Section 120.2(e)(4), Title 14, CCR).

Submit copies of the following:

- 1. Current Fish and Game Boat Registration for permit ed vessel.
- Report filed with the U.S. Coast Guard or other law enforcement agency invertigating the loss or destruction of your permitted vessel, or
 proof that the permitted vessel has suffered a major mechanical breakdown or has been seriously damaged.

Instructions to Transfer to a New Owner (Fee \$1,000.00)

Submit copies of the following:

- 1. Current Fish and Game Commercial Boat Registration for permitted essel.
- 2. Copy of proposed permittee's Commercial Fishing License.
- 3. Current Fish and Game Commercial Boat Registration for replacing the vessel (If transferring to a different vessel).
- U.S. Coast Guard Documentation for the replacement vessel of current proof of vessel ownership.
- 5. Marine survey for the replacement vessel completed by a certified marine surveyor on or after April 1, 1999, that shows the overall length of the replacement vessel or a current valid Federal Group tish Permit that shows the endorsed length of the replacement vessel. (Section 120.2(c)(3), Title 14, CCR).

Instructions Upon the Death of the Permittee (NO FEE)

On the death of a transferable NPSTVP permittee an heigen apply to the Department to transfer the permit to him or her. The application for transfer must be received by the Department within two years of the death of the permittee. (Section 120.2(e)(3), Title 14, CCR).

Submit copies of the following:

- 1. Deceased permittee's NPSTVP.
- 2. Death certificate of the permittee.
- 3. Proof that the person applying is an heir the permittee.

Evaluation of the transfer request should be completed within 20 business days after receipt by the license and Revenue Branch provided additional documentation is not required. If approved, a letter authorizing the transfer will be sent to the permittee with instructions on the process for completing the transfer.

Appeal Provisions and Deadling

If a transfer request is denied, the Department will notify the permittee in writing, explaining the reason for denial. The permittee may appeal the denial in writing to the Department within 90 days from the date of the denial. If the Department denies the appeal the permittee has the right to appeal such denial to the Fish and Game Commission within 60 days of the date of the Department's decision.
