Brief Project Summary: *Planning and design for habitat restoration and public access improvements on approximately 9 acres of land commonly known as Cordova Creek, located in Sacramento County, California.*

Over the next 6 months, Water Forum will continue engagement with the stakeholder review group, moving forward with CEQA compliance for the project, and applying for funding to support final design, permitting and implementation of the project.*

Describe any significant delays, oversights, or shortfalls with the project: *The Water Forum experienced a small funding shortfall for stakeholder engagement, habitat mapping and necessary modeling to serve fishery stakeholder agency needs. However, this difference was covered by the Water Forum and it can account for this need in future funding requests.*
