- **What:** Field trip learning about the development of the Truckee River Legacy Trail and human-wildlife conflict prevention

When: Wednesday, October 12, 2022, 3:30 pm

Where: Truckee River Regional Park, 10500 Brockway Road, Truckee, CA 96161

The Commission invites members of the public to join commissioners, staff, and California Department of Fish and Wildlife (Department) staff for a field trip Wednesday afternoon. Members of the public are welcome to attend but must provide their own transportation.

This field trip takes place outdoors. Please wear closed-toed shoes and be prepared to walk over uneven terrain. Additionally, please bring appropriately warm clothing, sun protection, and drinking water for the conditions.

Meeting Location

Meet in the parking lot of the Truckee River Regional Park, at the corner closest to the trailhead. From there, participants will take a short walk on the Truckee River Legacy Trail.

Field Trip Overview

This field trip will commence at the Trucked River Regional Park. From there, we will take a short walk up the Truckee River Legacy Trail (paved) and hear from the Truckee Donner Land Trust regarding development of the trail, including land transfers and acquisitions, and milestones toward completion.

After returning to the parking lot, Department staff will share information regarding state and local efforts to prevent human-wildlife conflict.

More Information

Truckee Donner Land Trust

Established in 1990, the <u>Truckee-Donner Land Trust (</u>TDLT) has preserved nearly 40,000 acres of open space, built trails, manages a campground, and has created numerous opportunities for the public to access and enjoy these lands. TDLT works with landowners, federal, state and local governments, and the public to carry out its conservation strategies. TDLT has numerous projects underway and expects to protect an additional 24,500 acres in the coming years with a value of over \$40 million.

Tahoe River Legacy Trail

<u>The Truckee River Legacy Trail</u> is a 6-mile, class 1 bike bath starting at the Truckee River Regional Park. When completed, the trail will connect Donner Memorial State Park to the Glenshire neighborhood. The majority of the trail will parallel the Truckee River. Several phases of the project are complete; <u>phase 4 of the project</u> is currently in the design and construction phase.
