



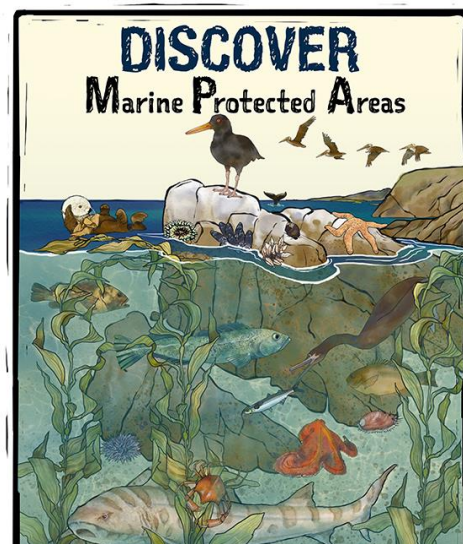
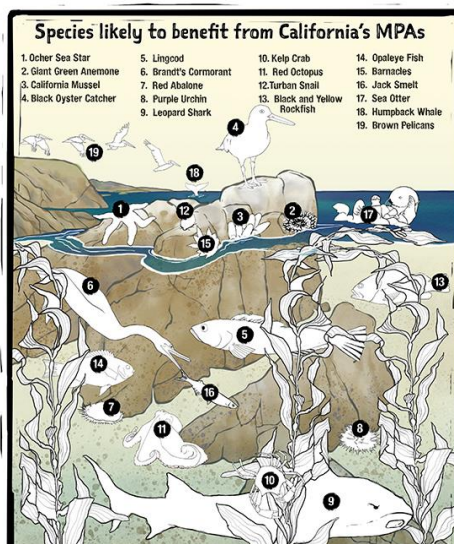
Phase 6 Outreach/Education Final Report

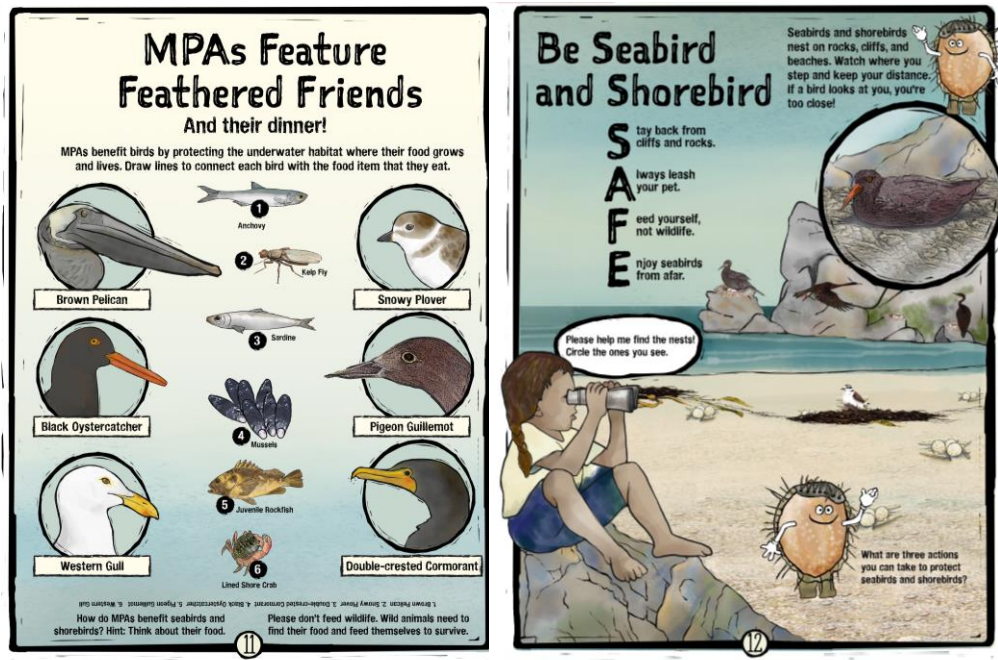
September 1, 2018 – October 31, 2019 +

- September 23-29, 2018 - SPN Outreach staff co-hosted **Sea Otter Awareness Week** with an emphasis on protecting all wildlife in Morro Bay with wildlife awareness messaging and safe wildlife viewing guidelines. We debuted our new wildlife distances interactive display board with seabird models.



- SLO MPA Collaborative** with the lead of the SPN Outreach Coordinator is finalized the MPA Coastal California Coastal Explorer Guide that has two pages on seabirds and seabird SAFE viewing. Note: It is currently being printed in Spanish and is also available for download with a certificate at mpacollaborative.org.

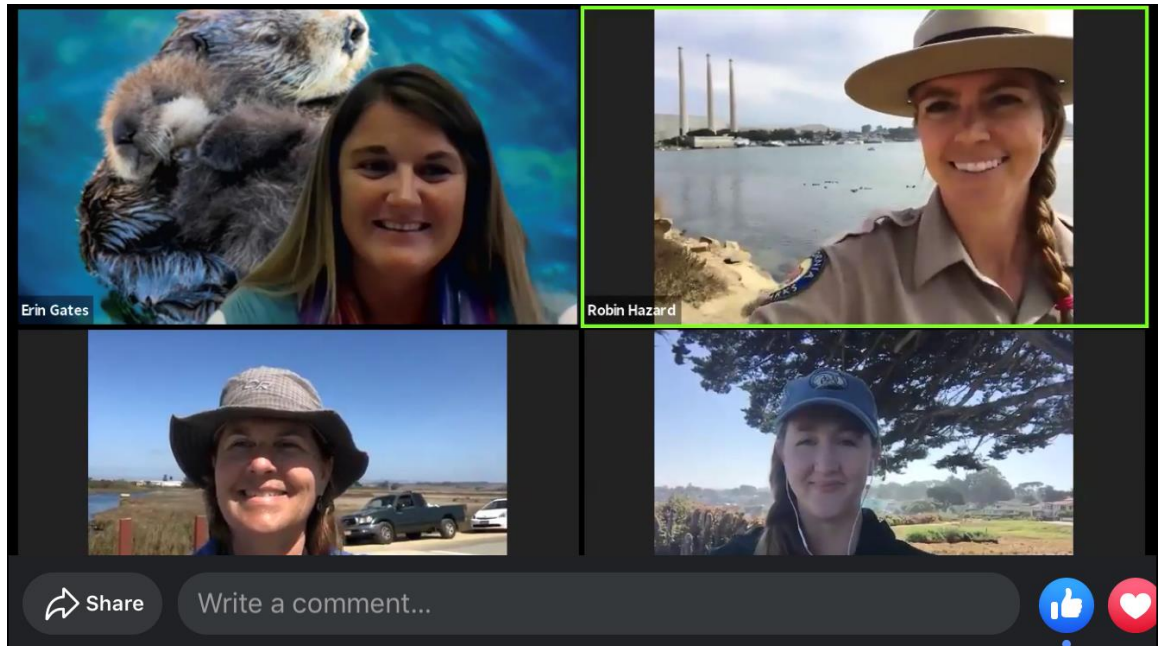




- SPN Outreach Coordinator works with **City of Pismo Beach** to create **two Seabird SAFE interpretive panels**, one for the newly renovated Pismo Pier and one for Dinosaur Caves Park.
- SPN Outreach Coordinator works with the Respect Wildlife campaign and plans the **4th Annual Wildlife Disturbance Symposium** for November 5, 2018 at the Monterey Bay Aquarium. The event featured seabird presentations.
- January 2019 **Facebook Live broadcast for King Tides** features black oystercatchers with Jodi Isaacs, California State Parks Environmental Scientist and seabird Interpreter.
- 3/8/19 **Del Mar Elementary School Citizen Science Day Camp** seabird presentations for **54** students
- 5/23/19 **Train 30 CA State Park Ranger and LG cadets during BVST 41** how to give seabird SAFE citizen science presentations for school groups and adults.
- 6/8/19 SPN Outreach staff host Facebook Live focusing on importance of Morro Bay for seabirds and wildlife and safe viewing guidelines and volunteer opportunities to protect wildlife during **World Oceans Day**
- 6/22/19 **Summer Solstice Celebration** seabird outreach booth for **525** attendees in Morro Bay State Park learning to be seabird SAFE
- From May to October 2019 SPN Outreach Staff provide training, mentoring, support, data compilation, and volunteer coordination for the

third season of **SeaLife Stewards Kayak and Land volunteers** providing outreach and conducting citizen science disturbance monitoring in Morro Bay (kayak and land) and Shell Beach (land shifts). **30 new volunteers plus 25 returning.**

- September 23-29, 2019 - SPN Outreach staff co-hosted **Sea Otter Awareness Week** with an emphasis on protecting all wildlife in Morro Bay with wildlife awareness messaging and safe wildlife viewing guidelines. We had a successful FaceBook Live event!



- November 2019 Seabird Outreach Coordinator is featured on **Walking California for PBS** and invites Jodi Isaacs to give seabird SAFE viewing messages. Show to debut in April 2020.
- SPN Outreach Coordinator writes seabird SAFE messaging for an additional two new **interpretive MPA panels** to be installed at WR Hearst Memorial Beach and Piedras Blancas Motel trailhead in Hearst San Simeon State Park to be installed in early 2020.



- SPN Outreach Coordinator works with the Respect Wildlife campaign and executes the **5th Annual Wildlife Disturbance Symposium** in November 2019 at the William Penn Mott Jr. Training Center in Pacific Grove. Talks on seabirds were presented by Point Blue Conservation Science.
- The K-12 Skype in the Classroom **virtual field** trip A Bird's Eye View into MPAs launched in April 2019 and has included 78 presentations for 3,120 students to date. We also presented in park and outreach programs for students during the grant period including programs for under-represented communities.
