New Funding Opportunities

Drought Resiliency – Protecting Salmon (\$100 million)

- o Up to \$10 million available for projects within the Scott River and its tributaries
- o Up to \$10 million available for projects within the Shasta River and its tributaries
- Projects will need to show support from Native American Tribes and local landowners or landowner associations when applying

Addressing Climate Impacts (\$35 million)

Nature Based Solutions

- Wetlands and Mountain Meadows Restoration (\$54 million)
- Wildlife Corridors (\$42 million)



Continuing Grant Opportunities

Proposition 1

- Watershed Restoration Grant Program (\$11 million)
- Delta Water Quality and Ecosystem Restoration Grant Program (\$14 million)

Proposition 68

- Rivers and Stream Restoration (\$6 million)
- Southern Steelhead Habitat Restoration (\$16 million)
- Klamath-Trinity Restoration (\$4 million)

Eligible Applicants: tribes, nonprofit organizations and public agencies

Project Types

- Planning
- Implementation
- Acquisition

All projects must have a significant benefit to fish and wildlife. Demonstrated consistency with stakeholder-vetted recovery planning efforts is encouraged.

CDFW is also interested in projects that:

- Benefit disadvantaged or historically underrepresented communities
- Expand the diversity of participating organizations and project types
- Demonstrate strong and meaningful community support, and
- Expand the capacity of the overall restoration community to engage in future restoration actions

The California Department of Fish and Wildlife's Cutting the Green Tape (CGT) program is a statewide effort to increase the pace and scale of habitat restoration by creating and implementing new environmental permitting and grant funding tools.

Restoration Permitting and CEQA Tools



Restoration Management Permit (RMP)

The RMP is a consolidated take authorization for both state listed species and Fully Protected species.



Restoration Consistency Determination (CD)

Restoration Consistency
Determinations are fast, free. and provide take coverage for animals that are both state and federally listed.



Habitat Restoration and Enhancement Act (HREA)

HREA combines a CEQA receiption, LSA, CESA permit, and integrates with a Clean Water Act 401 certification for small restoration projects.



Statutory Exemption for Restoration Projects (SERP)

Does your restoration project need CEQA coverage? SERP can save substantial money and time for qualifying projects.

- Project Description
- Scope of Work with tasks and deliverables
- Schedule, budget
- Map, plans and other available attachments (as appropriate as needed)
