The goals of <u>California Invasive Species Action Week (CISAW)</u> are to increase public awareness of invasive species issues and promote public participation in the fight against California's invasive species and their impacts on our natural resources. As part of CISAW, the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) encourages local organizations to get the word out about the detrimental impacts of invasive species and local efforts to stop them. This toolkit provides activity suggestions, sample social media posts, and other resources that local organizations can use during Action Week or any time you would like to highlight invasive species.

Suggested In-Person Activities

- Hold a volunteer day to remove invasive plants or plant native species.
- Give a tour of a restoration site.
- Give a presentation to a local group or local government.
- Have a booth at a local festival or farmers market
- Create a display of local invasive species and the work of local organizations at a library or other public building.

Suggested Virtual Activities

- Give a webinar or record a slideshow on local invasive species and their impacts.
- Give a tour of your restoration project using a tool such as Facebook Live.
- Record a video following your staff or volunteers in invasive species monitoring or removal.
- Encourage visitors to your park or other open space to report invasive species with an app (see below). Use your social media to show them a few species you are especially interested in tracking.
- Ask your audience to submit photos to your social media showing them taking actions to prevent the spread of invasive species (tagging your organization and #CISAW). See the table below for websites that provide tips on how to stop the spread.
- Post an online quiz about local invasive species. Offer a small prize, such as a sticker, for entries and consider giving one "grand" prize like t-shirt or water bottle.
- Play Clean Go has suggestions on how to adjust posts for your audience and measure your impact in <u>"4 Steps to Better Invasive Species Outreach."</u>

Invasive Species Reporting

Tracking invasive species is an activity that can be done anywhere, as a group or individually! CDFW partnered with <u>EDDMaps</u>, a national online system for reporting invasive species, to develop a list of high-priority species in California. Submit reports via the EDDMaps website or by downloading the EDDMaps app for iPhone or Android). In the app, select "California" as your state to download a species list. Set up a free user account to submit observations. The CDFW EDDMaps list focuses on animals. Reports go to CDFW and will help our invasive species work.
