- 2022 Public Draft Documents (EIR & NRMP)
- 2023 − Final EIR & NRMP Approved (Feb. 28)

NRMP Key Actions

- Protect & Enhance Natural Resources
 - → 22 Goals & 45 Objectives Across 5 Goal Areas
 - Biological, Physical, and Cultural Resources
 - ➤ Human Use Impact Reduction
 - ➤ Agency & Community Coordination
 - Management Actions Identified
 - → ~ 65 Specific Potential Projects
 - General Actions Across Parkway

NRMP - Data Gaps

- Quantify Area in Each Management Category
 - → Conservation, Restoration, Naturalization
 - Mapping & Surveys <u>Needed</u> to Determine Quality
 - Vegetation Communities, Social Trails, Encampments, Burned Areas



NRMP - Data Gaps (Cont.)

- Mapping & Surveys Needed to....
 - → Prioritize Areas for Restoration/Naturalization
 - ➤ Native Riparian Woodlands, Grasslands, etc.,
 - Prioritizing Areas for Rehabilitation
 - Burned Areas, Social Trails, Encampments
 - Inform Plan Preparation
 - Wildlife Connectivity & Barrier Removal Plan
 - ➤ Wildfire Prevention, Response & Recovery Plan



Key Challenges

- Implementing 22 Goals & 45 Objectives
 - ➤ Est. Cost \$18M
 - → Additional Support Requesting
 - Associate Planner & Natural Resource Specialist
- Prioritization of Projects: 5-Year Work Plan
 - → Identifies \$16M Potential Grant Opportunities
 - Identifies Projects in Progress

- **2** 2023-2024 − Parks' Funded
 - ➤ Community Science Development (Goal 5.5)
 - → Resource Data Gaps Identify Research Needs (Goal 5.5)
 - Educational Partnerships (Goal 5.5)
 - → Utility Corridor Management Agreements (Goal 4.4)
- 2023-2024 Grant Funding Needed
 - → Mapping & Surveys (*Goals 1.1, 1.6, 4.1*)
 - **▶** Estimated Cost \$750,000



Projects to Initiate (Cont.)

- 2023-2024 Grant Funding Needed (Cont.)
 - → Wildfire Rehabilitation & Wildlife Connectivity Plans
 - ➤ Estimated Cost \$200,000
 - Restore/Naturalize Grassland (3 ac) Woodland (6 ac)
 - ➤ Estimated Cost \$465,00
- 2024-2025 Grant Funding Needed
 - Utility Corridor Habitat Enhancement (Goal 4.4)
 - ➤ Estimated Cost \$875,000



Projects to Initiate (Cont.)

- 2024-2025 Grant Funding Needed (cont.)
 - Restore Riparian (5 ac), Implement Wildfire Plan, Reduce/Remove Wildlife Barriers
 - ➤ Estimated Cost ~ \$13M
- **2** 2025-2026 − Funded by Others
 - → Light Pollution Baseline Survey & Plan (Parks)
 - ➤ Naturalize Riparian (40 ac), Grasslands (45 ac), Woodlands (86 ac) USACE Ecosystem Restoration



Next Step

- 2023 LARC Support & Consideration
 - → April Mapping & Surveys Pre-App. Process
 - Vegetation Communities (Native & Non-native)
 - Habitat (Sensitive Species & Wildlife Barriers)
 - Degraded Habitat (Socials Trails, Burn Scars, etc.,)
 - ➤ Identifies and Quantifies high-quality habitat
 - October LAR Advisory Committee
