Casco Busan Trustee Council Resolution Regarding Disbursement of Funds for Recreational Use Restoration Projects for Fiscal Year 2019

- 1. The State of California, acting through the Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) and the California State Lands Commission (CSLC); the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA); and the Department of the Interior (DOI), acting through the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) and the National Park Service (NPS), are the trustees responsible for restoring those natural resources injured by the discharge of oil from the *M/V Cosco Busan* on November 7, 2007.
- 2. Sums recovered in the civil action United States v. *M/V Cosco Busan* et al., and related actions, are being held in the DOI Natural Resource Damage Assessment and Restoration Fund (NRDAR Fund) and the San Francisco Bay Shoreline Parks and Recreational Use account established by the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF Rec Account).
- 3. The trustees have entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) among themselves creating the Cosco Busan Trustee Council for the purpose of coordinating their trust responsibilities.
- 4. The MOU requires the Trustee Council to memorialize all decisions authorizing expenditures of funds from the above-referenced accounts in a Trustee Council Resolution signed by the participating voting members. The settlement funds may only be used for the design, implementation, permitting (as necessary), monitoring and oversight of restoration projects and for the costs of complying with the requirements of law to conduct a restoration planning and implementation process. The MOU further requires that in all cases, use of such funds be documented and an accounting provided to the Cosco Busan Trustee Council.
- 5. The Trustee Council provided implementation funds to the Richardson Bay Audubon Society through a USFWS cooperative agreement for the Aramburu Island Restoration Project. At the end of the cooperative agreement with the Audubon Society \$1,663.11 of unspent allocated funds remained. The Trustee Council acknowledges that the excess funds have been de-obligated from the cooperative agreement and authorizes USFWS to retain these funds and redirect them towards USFWS Cosco Busan Trustee Council administrative and participation costs.

The Trustees have estimated administrative and project oversight expenses for the 2019 fiscal year (Oct 1, 2018 to Sept 30, 2019). The table below summarizes the Trustees' need for funds:

- 7. The Trustee Council hereby approves a disbursement from the NRDAR. Fund in the amounts and to the recipients identified in the preceding paragraphs to cover administrative costs and project oversight.
- 8. Each trustee agency shall submit a full and final cost documentation package, including supporting documentation, for fiscal year 2018 by March 31, 2019.
- 9. This Resolution does not limit the number of additional advance funding requests that can be made during fiscal year 2019.
- 10. This Trustee Council Resolution may be executed in counterparts. A copy with all original executed signature pages affixed shall constitute the original Resolution and be retained by the Lead Administrative Trustee that maintains records.
- 11. The effective date of this resolution shall be the date on which the last Trustee signs this document.
