Cosco Busan Trustee Council Resolution Regarding Disbursement of Funds for Recreational Use Restoration Projects for Fiscal Year 2015

- 1. The State of California, acting through the Department of Fish and Game (CDFG) and the California State Lands Commission (CSLC); the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA); and the Department of the Interior (DOI), acting through the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) and the National Park Service (NPS), are the trustees responsible for restoring those natural resources injured by the discharge of oil from the *MN Casco Busan* on November 7, 2007.
- 2. Sums recovered in the civil action United States v. MN Cosco Busan et al., and related actions, are being held in the DOI Natural Resource Damage Assessment and Restoration Fund (NRDAR Fund) and the San Francisco Bay Shoreline Parks and Recreational Use account established by the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF Rec Account).
- 3. The Trustees have entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) among themselves for the purpose of coordinating their trust responsibilities.
- 4. The MOU specifies several procedural prerequisites to the implementation of projects selected in the Restoration Plan. Among other things, a selected project may not proceed unless a lead Trustee has been designated for that project and the Trustee Council has given its written authorization to commence the project.
- 3. The MOU further requires the Trustee Council to memorialize all expenditures of funds from the above-referenced accounts in a Trustee Council Resolution signed by the participating voting members. The settlement funds may only be used for the design, implementation, permitting (as necessary), monitoring and oversight of restoration projects and for the costs of complying with the requirements of law to conduct a restoration planning and implementation process. The use of such funds must be documented and an accounting provided to the Cosco Busan Trustee Council.
- 4. The Trustee Council hereby authorizes the disbursement of the following funds from the NRDAR Fund for the implementation of certain restoration projects, as described in supplements to the Cosco Busan Damage Assessment and Restoration Plan (DARP)/Environmental Assessment.
 - \$2,363,600 to NPS for implementation of the following recreational use projects:

San Francisco County

- Ocean Beach O'Shaughnessey Seawall Repairs, Phase 2 (\$850,200)
- Torpedo Wharf Safety Repairs, Phase 2: Title 1 and II Design Services and Supplemental Geotechnical and Underwater Pile Surveys (\$475,000)

- Bay Trail Repair Retaining Wall on McDowell Road at Fort Mason, Phase 2 Construction (\$874,400)
- Waterfront Railing and Apron Renovation at Fort Mason Center (\$164,000)
- 5. This Resolution may be executed in counterparts. A copy with all original executed signature pages affixed shall constitute the original Resolution and be retained by the Lead Administrative Trustee that maintains records.
- 6. The effective date of this resolution shall be the date on which the last Trustee Signs this resolution.
