ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Hunters must have a valid/current California hunting license and Upland Game Bird validation. Junior hunters do not need an Upland Game Bird validation. A junior hunter must be accompanied by a non-shooting adult 18 years of age or older. All shooters and non-shooters must wear shooting/safety glasses, blaze orange, and initial and sign a waiver (enclosed), for the hunt. Your guest(s) must be present with you when you check in.

Nonlead ammunition is required when taking any wildlife with a firearm anywhere in California. Please plan accordingly.

The Department may make blaze orange vests and Shooting Safety Glasses available on a loan basis. However, failure of the Department to have these items available for loan does not relieve the Hunt Participant from using these items.

Please come prepared and wear appropriate gear for the hunt; we strongly recommend you bring water, a hat, sturdy shoes/boots, sweater/jacket, and a cooler with ice for your birds. For safety, Apprentice hunters must have a properly fitting shotgun. Please note if you are not prepared for the hunt or your gear is deemed unsafe you may be asked to withdraw from the hunt.

The Upland Game Bird Special Hunts Program is pleased to offer you this special hunt. Practice good sportsmanship, enjoy your hunt and most of all, be a safe hunter. SHASTA VALLEY WILDLIFE AREA Special Rules And Information For The Hunt

- 1. The use of shooting safety glasses with an ANSI rating of Z87.1 or above by all entering the field is required. DFW will make available shooting safety glasses on a loan basis to participants who choose to borrow them.
- 2. A minimum of one non-hunting adult (18 years or older) must accompany up to two juniors in the field.
- 3. All participants must bring their own non-lead ammunition and shotgun. Persons accompanying junior hunters may not possess any firearm and may not hunt under any circumstances.
- 4. This permit may not be transferred to another person. If you cannot participate in the hunt please notify the office at (530) 459-3926 as soon as possible.
- 5. The limit is two rooster pheasants, non-lead shot only.
- 6. It is suggested that bright clothing and comfortable walking shoes be worn. Wet or swampy conditions may be present in the hunt area. Waterproof shoes or knee high boots might come in handy. "Blaze Orange" (hunter orange hat and or vest) is Mandatory for all participants while in the field. The Department will make Blaze orange vests available on a loan basis.
- 7. There will be a safety and orientation meeting at the time of check in at the headquarters area. **Attendance is mandatory.**

The Ten Commandments of Firearms Safety:

- 1. Watch that muzzle! Keep it pointed in a safe direction at all times.
 - 2. Treat every firearm with the respect due a loaded gun.
- 3. Be sure of your target and what is in front of it and beyond it.
- 4. Keep your finger outside the trigger guard until ready to shoot .
 - 5. Check your barrel and ammunition.
 - 6. Unload firearms when not in use.
 - 7. Point your firearm only at something you intend to shoot.
 - 8. Don't run, jump, or climb with a loaded firearm.
 - 9. Store firearms and ammunition separately and safely.
- 10. Don't drink alcohol, use drugs or take medications that might impair your abilities and good judgment before or while handling firearms or archery equipment.
