Pete Bontadelli, Administrator of the Office of Oil Spill Prevention and Response, will open the program with an overview detailing state, local, and federal

government goals for the drill.

Day two will see several panels, comprised of leading industry, environmental, and government experts discuss how they would work jointly in response to a spill off the central coast. Panel members will be provided with a spill scenario that involves a tanker collision off the Monterey coast, with spilled oil threatening the shoreline inside Monterey Bay.
