GRANT AMOUNT

Up to \$10,000 annually

WHO CAN APPLY

California Tribes listed on the Native American Heritage Commission website.

GRANT INCLUDES

- 24-hour HAZWOPER (Hazardous Waste and Emergency Response) training;
- Oil spill-related trainings such as Environmental Response to Oil Spills, Continuing Challenge Workshop, Prevention First Workshop and an Overview of CDFW-OSPR Program;
- Participation in the CDFW-OSPR preparedness activities and serve as the Tribal Representative for the Geographic Response Plans and the United States Coast Guard Area Contingency Planning Committees;
- Attendance to tabletop and industry-led oil spill drills and exercises.
