Proposed Regulatory Language

Section 551, Title 14, CCR, is amended to read as follows:

§ 551. Additional Visitor Use Regulations on Department Lands Designated as Wildlife Areas.

- (a) The areas listed in Section 551 have been designated by the commission as wildlife areas. All wildlife areas are maintained for the primary purposes of developing a statewide program of ecological conservation, restoration, preservation, development and management of wildlife and wildlife habitat and hunting. A legal description of the boundaries of each wildlife area is on file at the department's headquarters, 1416 9th Street, Sacramento and may be obtained by contacting Department of Fish and Wildlife, Lands Program, P.O. Box 944209, Sacramento, CA 94244-2090. Visitor use is subject to the regulations below and in sections 550 and 550.5, as well as any other sections of Title 14, CCR, and the Fish and Game Code that may apply. These regulations are incorporated by reference into and become a condition of entry and/or permits. Visitors are responsible for knowing and understanding these regulations prior to entry.

- (y) Fishing Regulations on Wildlife Areas pursuant to subsections 550(c)(2)(C) and 550(h) of these regulations:
 - The property–specific fishing regulations in this subsection are in addition to the general regulations regarding fishing and the hours of operation of department lands located in Section 550 of these regulations.
 - (1) Clifton Court Forebay: Fishing from shore only. No wading into water. No fishing from boats.

- (z) Permits for public use. With regard to any permit specified in this section which is not specified elsewhere in these regulations or the Fish and Game Code, and for which an issuing entity is not otherwise identified, and for which the public use is otherwise authorized, for parking, camping, access to specific areas within a department land, hunting or fishing in specific areas within a department land, or other public uses, the department may issue the specified permits. The department shall determine whether to issue the specified permits, as well as how permits are distributed, whether on a first-come-first-serve basis, self-registration by individuals, or some other equitable means. The department shall determine the maximum duration of each type of permit, not to exceed one year. Unless otherwise specified, these permits shall not have a fee. Permits may be obtained in person at the wildlife area or another facility associated with that wildlife area, or by written or online application, or a combination of these methods; specific information on how to obtain a permit shall be posted on the department website for the corresponding wildlife area.
 - (1) Criteria. The department shall determine permit distribution, duration, terms and conditions, and other specifications based on:
 - (A) the purposes of the wildlife area designation,
 - (B) the potential for visitor conflict,
 - (C) the infrastructure, capacity, and staffing available to support the permitted activity, and
 - (D) the protection of natural resources.
 - (2) Permit revocation. Consistent with subsection 550(c)(3), the department may revoke a permit issued pursuant to this section.
