Notice of Receipt of Recommendation and Consideration of Experimental Fishing Permit Application

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that, pursuant to the provisions of Section 1022 of the Fish and Game Code (FGC) and Section 91, Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations (CCR), on March 29, 2024 the California Fish and Game Commission (Commission) received the California Department of Fish and Wildlife's (Department) recommendation regarding the Experimental Fishing Permit (EFP) application to evaluate the potential for a commercial fishery for brown box crab, and to evaluate the feasibility of using on-demand buoy retrieval systems in deep water (50-125 fathoms) (EFP ID Tracking #2024-01). Consistent with subsections 91(e)(2) and (91)(f), Title 14, CCR the Commission has scheduled the EFP application for consideration at its June 19-20, 2024 meeting at Mammoth Lakes.

EFP Project Description

The EFP application requests a Tier 4 (Department facilitated) exploratory fishing EFP with a permit fee reduction for testing on-demand buoy retrieval systems (also known as "pop-up" fishing systems). The purpose of the proposed project is to provide data from the area between Pigeon Point, San Mateo County to the Sonoma/Mendocino County line to evaluate the potential for a commercial fishery for brown box crab, and to evaluate the feasibility of using on-demand buoy retrieval systems in deep water (50-125 fathoms).

Department Recommendation

Pursuant to subsection 91(d)(2), Title 14, CCR, the EFP application was accepted by the Department for technical review on February 8, 2024. The Department completed its evaluation of the application and transmitted its recommendation to the Commission on March 29, 2024. The Department recommends to deny the EFP application at this time. While the proposed research activities are of interest to the Department, the Department recommends that existing EFPs focused on similar gear and species be completed and evaluated prior to undertaking similar research in a different area. Secondly, managing existing EFPs requires significant staff time and resources; adding another EFP with significant Department oversight at this time would strain the Department's capacity.
