Step 1: Does your proposed project occur within an approved RCIS and propose credits that are implementing actions in that RCIS?

If yes, Bank or MCA is an option. If no, use Bank, go to Supplement.

Step 2: Are you proposing a project with excess mitigation?

If yes, use MCA. If no, Are you proposing non-permanent\* credits?<sup>3</sup>\*land without permanent protection and credits for a set period of time.

If yes, use MCA, go to Supplement. If no, go to Step 3.

Step 3: Do you want to use a traditional advance mitigation process with access to all MOU agencies?

If yes, use Bank, go to Supplement. If no, use MCA, go to Supplement

Supplement: Does the proposal include a wildlife connectivity action?

If yes, use the supplemental Wildlife Connectivity Advance Mitigation Guidelines with your Bank or MCA option." If no, no additional action.
