



Region 2 Barrier ID: W015 (Barrier).

Barrier Name: SR-16 Cache Creek to SR-20.

Linear Infrastructure: SR-16.

Geographic Area: Colusa County, from SR-16 North of Cache Creek to SR-20.

Length: 5.64 km (3.51 mi).

Target Species: Tule elk (*Cervus canadensis nannodes*), deer (*Odocoileus hemionus*), wild pig (*Sus scrofa*), mountain lion (*Puma concolor*).

Connectivity Concerns: SR-16 runs along Bear Creek cutting off access to the creek from the east side. California Department of Fish and Wildlife collar data indicates that there is little movement across the highway in this area, and it has also been the site of animal vehicle collision. The endemic tule elk has already been close to extirpation and is genetically vulnerable.

Remediation Goals: Expand and enhance existing infrastructure such as culverts and creek bridges and use wildlife exclusion fencing to direct wildlife.




Figure: SR-16 along Bear Creek to the intersection with SR-20 is a Region 2 wildlife connectivity barrier.
