



Region 1 Barrier ID: W066 (Barrier).

Barrier Name: Along SR- 3 North to intersection SR-3/CR-133.

Linear Infrastructure: SR-3.

Geographic Area: Trinity County.

Length: 62.40 km (38.78 mi).

Target Species: Deer (*Odocoileus hemionus*), black bear (*Ursus americanus*), fisher (*Pekania pennanti*), foothill yellow-legged frog (*Rana boylei*), mesocarnivores.

Connectivity Concerns: The barrier significantly disrupts (>50%) a linkage identified in a species movement study, regional connectivity study, or Conceptual Area Protection Plan, or significantly disrupts connectivity between or within important habitat blocks. It bisects an ungulate migration corridor that has been mapped based on GPS collar data or expert knowledge. Some evidence indicates sensitive or high priority species present that may be impacted by the barrier. Expert knowledge or data indicates wildlife mortality of two or more species, but population-level impacts not expected.

Remediation Goals: Additional data collection and analysis is required. Possible remediation goals include expanding and enhancing existing infrastructure such as culverts and creek bridges, create new overpass and wildlife exclusion fencing.
