

Region 2 Barrier ID: W192 (Barrier).

Barrier Name: SR-49 Sierraville to Loyalton.

Linear Infrastructure: SR-49

Geographic Area: Sierra County, SR-49 from Sierraville to Loyalton through the Sierra Valley.

Length: 18.18 km (11.30 mi).

**Target Species:** Gray wolf (*Canis lupus*), deer (*Odocoileus hemionus*), mountain lion(*Puma concolor*), black bear (*Ursus americanus*), Rocky Mountain elk (*Cervus canadensis nelsoni*), pronghorn (*Antilocapra americana*).

**Connectivity Concerns:** This stretch of SR-49 has observed animal vehicle collision and presence of wildlife on the highway. Migratory and resident deer in the Loyalton-Truckee deer herd cross the highway annually in spring and fall and population level effects are a concern. Wildlife, including wolves and elk, are present and there are no options to get across the highway in this stretch.

**Remediation Goals:** Expand and enhance existing infrastructure such as culverts and creek/river bridges, add new wildlife crossing structures and wildlife exclusion fencing.




Figure: SR-49 from Sierraville to Loyalton is a Region 2 wildlife connectivity barrier.
