



Region 4 Barrier ID: W211 (Barrier).

Barrier Name: US-101 Camp Roberts.

Linear Infrastructure: US-101.

Geographic Area: San Miguel to San Ardo.

Length: 27.87 km (17.32 mi).

Target Species: Badger (*Taxidea taxus*), black bear (*Ursus americanus*), mountain lion (*Puma concolor*), deer (*Odocoileus hemionus*), tule elk (*Cervus canadensis nannodes*), western spadefoot toad (*Spea hammondi*).

Connectivity Concerns: US-101 bisects the only east-west landscape linkage between the Santa Lucia Range and the Gabilans Range, a connection essential in keeping the interior Coast Ranges (Gabilan and Diablos) and by extension the Santa Cruz Mountains, connected to the Santa Lucias. This connectivity area includes riparian habitats along the Salinas River that are federally protected and span the highway in Camp Roberts.

Remediation Goals: Install directional fencing, add new under-crossings, and expand/enhance existing infrastructure such as culverts and creek bridges.

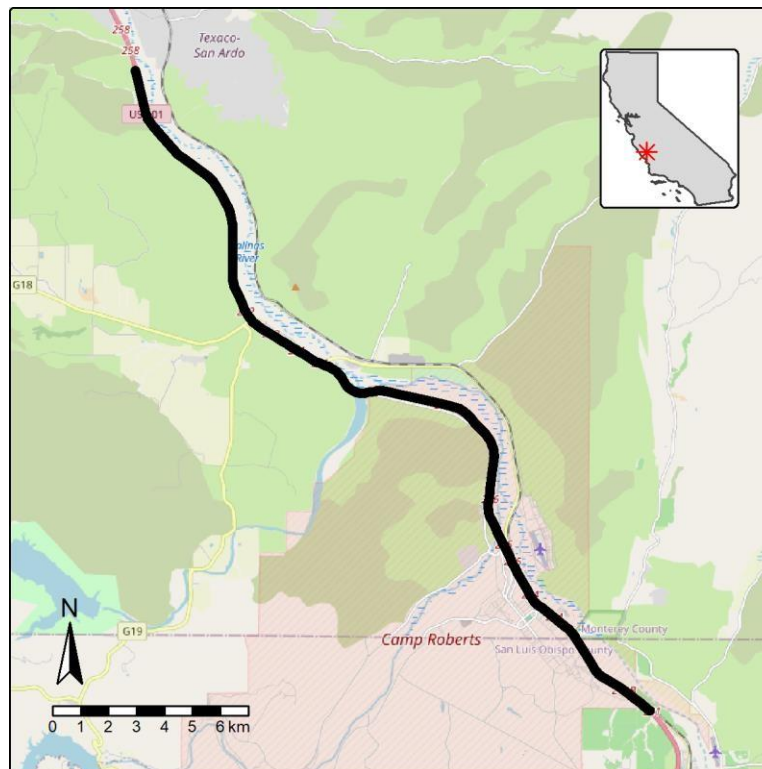


Figure: US-101 (Camp Roberts) between San Miguel and San Ardo is a Region 4 wildlife connectivity barrier.
