## Dear Erika Guerra:

On April 17, 2025, the Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) received your Incidental Take Permit Application for Major Amendment 3 and on April 28, 2025, CDFW received the appropriate Major Amendment application fee. CDFW reviewed your request for authorization, pursuant to Fish and Game Code section 2081(b), to extend coverage for incidental take¹ of Longfin smelt (*Spirinchus thaleichthys*), a species designated as threatened, Delta Smelt (*Hypomesus transpacificus*), a species designated as endangered, Central Valley spring-run Chinook salmon (*Oncorhynchus tshawytscha*), a species designated as threatened, Sacramento River winter-run Chinook Salmon (*Oncorhynchus tshawytscha*), a species designated as endangered] pursuant to the California Endangered Species Act (CESA) (Fish & G. Code, § 2050 et seq.). (See Cal. Code Regs., tit. § 670.5, subd. (a)(2)(M,O), subd. (b)(2)(C,E).) **CDFW has determined that the above-referenced application for Major Amendment 3 is complete**.

CDFW has 90 days from the date the application is accepted as complete to finalize the Amendment, in accordance with the California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Section 783.5. CDFW cannot finalize the Permit until CDFW has received your certified California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) document along with the Findings, Notice of Determination, and a copy of proof of payment for the environmental filing fee.
