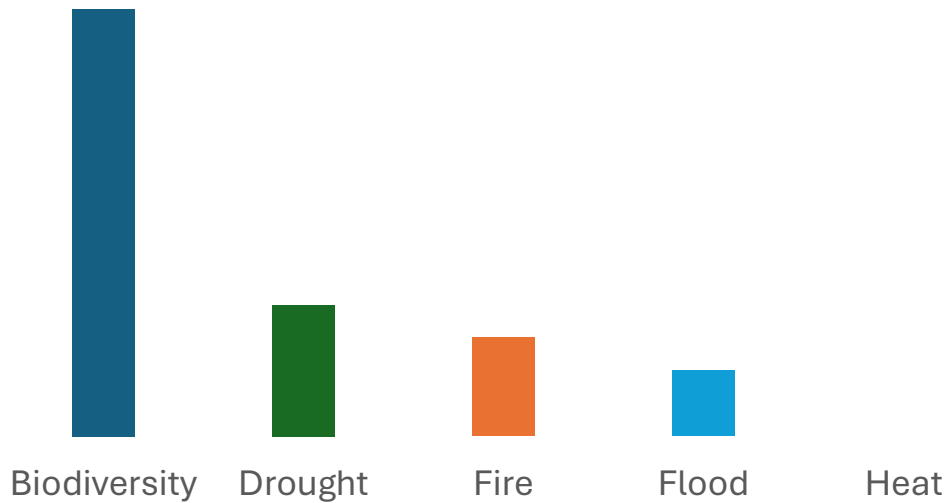


2. What is the biggest climate threat to the Parkway?

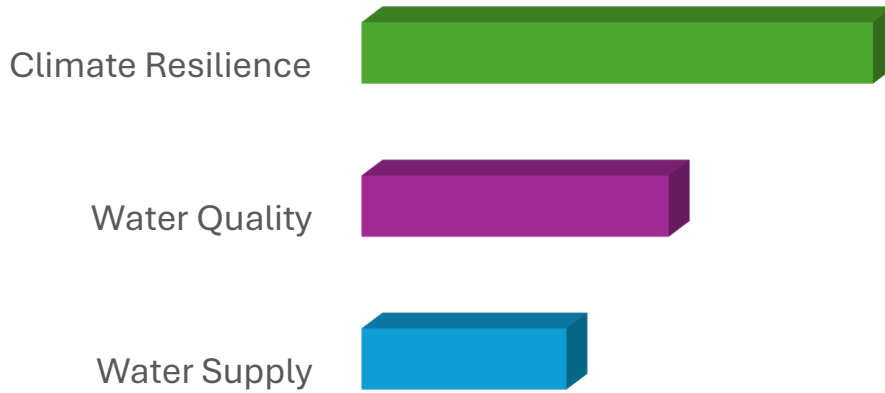

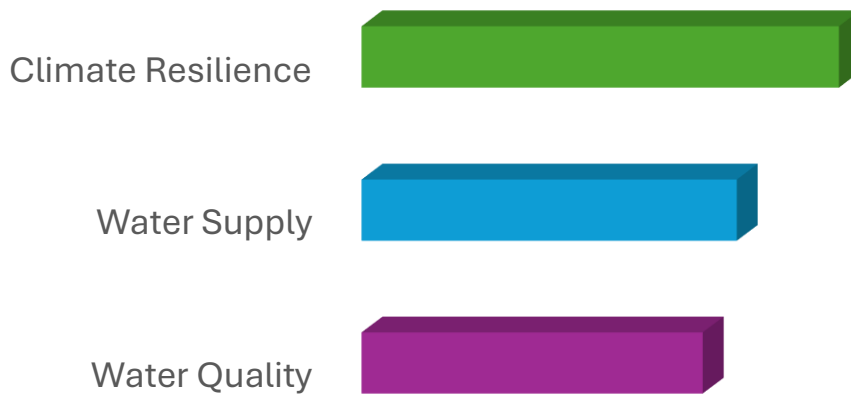


3. Rank the following Prop 4 investment goals in order of priority for improving the Parkway.

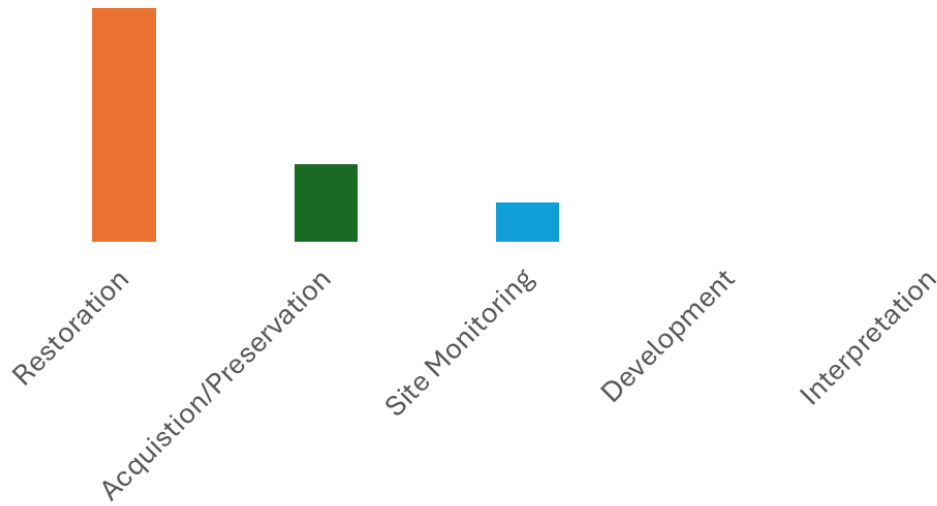

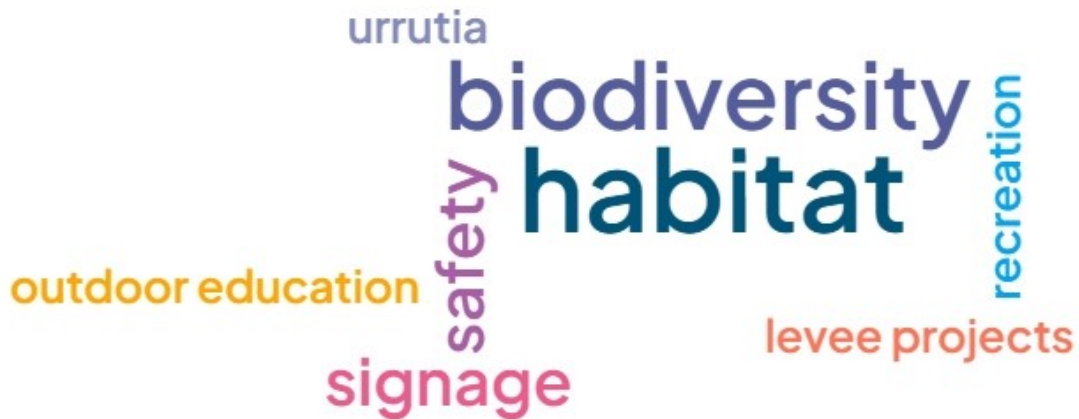

Key Takeaways

1. Investing in habitat and public access will improve the enjoyment of the Parkway.
2. Fire and biodiversity loss are the Parkway's biggest climate threats.
3. Invest Prop 4 funding towards advancing previous investments and implementation projects that improve climate resilience in habitats and wetlands Parkway-wide.
4. Best way to protect the Parkway is through restoration including planting native vegetation, restoring riparian and upland habitat types, and acquiring more land for preservation.
5. People are most concerned about the Parkway's natural resources, and their favorite places are concentrated in the upper Parkway.
6. People view LARCP as needed for the preservation and restoration of the Parkway's resources.
