## **Background**

This is a standing agenda item for staff and the Department to request changes to the Commission's rulemaking timetable (Exhibit 2), confirm changes made by the Commission during this meeting, and highlight minor changes made by staff.

The Department requests four changes to the rulemaking timetable (Exhibit 1):

- Schedule the annual "Central Valley Sport Fishing" and "Klamath River Basin Sport Fishing" rulemakings, with notice in February 2026, discussion in April 2026, and adoption in May 2026. The anticipated effective dates are July 1, 2026 for the Klamath River Basin and July 15, 2026 for the Central Valley.
- Schedule a rulemaking titled "Inland Sport Fishing 2026," with notice in April 2026, discussion in June 2026, and adoption in August 2026. The anticipated effective date is January 1, 2027.
- Remove the "Big Game Hunting, 2026-2027 Seasons" rulemaking and separate it into three rulemakings: "Bighorn Sheep Hunting," amending Section 362; "Pronghorn Antelope Hunting," amending Section 363; and "Elk Hunting," amending sections 364, 364.1, and 555.1. Schedule the three rulemakings under the same timeline: notice in December 2025, discussion in February 2026, and adoption in April 2026.
- Make several additions to affected Title 14 sections for multiple rulemakings.

Commission staff requests two changes to the rulemaking timetable:

- Reschedule the "Commercial Coonstripe Shrimp Fishery" rulemaking from notice in October 2025 and discussion/adoption in December 2025 to notice in December 2025 and discussion/adoption in February 2026.
- Rename the "Donation of Sport Caught Fish" rulemaking to "Processing and Donating Sport Caught Fish" to better represent the scope of the regulations, and reschedule the rulemaking from notice in October 2025 and discussion/adoption in December 2025 to notice in December 2025 and discussion/adoption in February 2026.

Subject: October 2025 Request for Changes to the Fish and Game Commission's Timetable for Anticipated Regulatory Actions

The Department of Fish and Wildlife (Department) requests the following schedule changes to the Fish and Game Commission's (Commission's) 2025 regulatory timetable for amendments to Title 14 (T14), California Code of Regulations (CCR):

- 1. Schedule the recurring rulemakings, "Central Valley Sport Fishing (Annual)," and "Klamath River Basin Sport Fishing (Annual)," requesting to authorize notice at the February 2026 meeting, discuss at the April 2026 meeting, and adopt at the May 2026 teleconference, amending subsections 7.40(b)(4), (b)(43), (b)(66), and (b)(80) and amending 7.40(b)(50), respectively. These are standard rulemakings that occur annually as part of the Pacific Fishery Management Council process. The requested effective dates will be July 1, 2026 for the Klamath River Basin and July 15, 2026 for the Central Valley.
- 2. Remove the existing rulemaking, "Big Game Hunting, 2026-2027 Seasons" and add new "Bighorn Sheep Hunting," "Pronghorn Antelope Hunting," and "Elk Hunting" rulemakings to amend Sections 362; 363; and 364, 364.1, 555.1; respectively. The Department supports separating the individual species under consideration in the "Big game Hunting, 2026-2027 Seasons" rulemaking into individual items on the same schedule of notice in December 2025, discussion in February 2026, and adoption in April 2026.
- 3. Update the existing rulemaking, "Black Bear Hunting," to add Sections 366 and 708.12 to the list of affected T14 Sections.
- 4. Update the existing rulemaking, "Rattlesnake Exhibition" to reflect amendments to Section 42.1 and the addition of a new Section 43.
- 5. Update and schedule the existing rulemaking, "Inland Sport Fishing 2026" reflect amendments to Sections 1.73, 1.74, 2.10, 4.20, 5.00, 5.65, 5.85, 5.88, 6.34,

6.35, 7.00, 7.40 a 7.50, and 8.00. The changes include regulatory clean-up, means to increase fishing opportunities, changes related to gear use, protective changes, steelhead report card changes, and others. The Department requests to authorize notice at the April 2025 meeting, discuss at the June 2025 meeting and adopt at the August 2025 meeting, with an effective date of January 1, 2027.
