California Fish and Game Code Section 2073.5 requires that the Department evaluate the petition and submit a written evaluation with a recommendation to the Commission within 90 days of receiving the petition. Under this section, the Department may request an extension of up to 30 days to complete the evaluation.

(A) Petitions from John C. Hunter, Ph.D. to List 19 Plants

On August 29, 2025, the Commission received 19 petitions to list various species of plants as threatened or endangered under CESA. On September 8, 2025, staff transmitted the petitions to the Department for review. The Department has requested a 30-day extension to evaluate the petitions (Exhibit A1). If approved, the due date for the Department's petition evaluations would change to January 6, 2026.

(B) Bendire's Thrasher and LeConte's Thrasher

On September 16, 2025, the Commission received a petition from the Center for Biological Diversity to list Bendire's thrasher and LeConte's thrasher as threatened or endangered under CESA. On September 26, 2025, staff transmitted the petition to the Department for review. The Department has requested a 30-day extension to evaluate the petition (Exhibit B1). If approved, the due date for the Department's petition evaluation would change to January 24, 2026.

(C) Western Spadefoot

On September 24, 2025, the Commission received a petition from the Center for Biological Diversity to list the northern and southern populations of western spadefoot as threatened or endangered under CESA. On October 6, 2025, staff transmitted the petition to the Department for review. The Department has requested a 30-day extension to review the petition (Exhibit C1). If approved, the due date for the Department's petition evaluation would change to February 3, 2026.
