



BEST PRACTICES TO MINIMIZE MARINE LIFE ENTANGLEMENTS

CDFW reminds all California fixed gear fishery participants to implement the following best practices for avoiding marine life entanglements:

- **Minimize** knots, leads and scope.
- **Reduce** slack surface line and keep vertical lines taught.
- **Avoid** setting gear in the vicinity of all whales and sea turtles.
- **Frequently check** traps and remove traps when whales are foraging in the area.
- **Communicate** locations of whale activity to other fishing vessels.
- **Promptly remove** gear not being actively fished.

- Notify NMFS or the US Coast Guard
- Note date, time, location; take photos
- Maintain a distance of 100 yards
- Stand by for responders and **do not attempt to disentangle!**
- Respond promptly if contacted by NMFS or CDFW about your gear
