MONTHLY SQUID REPORT June 2005



Monterey

Squid landings remained steady throughout the month. Fishing activity occurred mainly at night off Cannery Row and the Beach Hotel. The ex-vessel price ranged from \$440-500/ton. Pacific sardine, northern anchovy, Pacific herring, jacksmelt, sanddabs, plainfin midshipman, Pacific electric rays, squid eggs, and kelp were observed as bycatch.

Squid quality was mediocre to poor. Most squid were small, and some were spawned out. Fisherman reported seeing very small concentrations of squid, with vessels setting on anything 500 pounds and up.

Ventura/Port Hueneme/Santa Barbara

No squid landings were reported this month. A few light boats searched around the Channel Islands at the beginning of the month, but the amount of squid that was spotted was small and scattered. Many of the boats from Ventura Harbor went to Alaska for the salmon season. New pilings have been installed at Port Hueneme, but the dock is still waiting to be resurfaced; it is not expected to be done before the end of the summer.

San Pedro/Terminal Island

There were no significant landings of squid this month. The fleet targeted wetfish and/or made repairs to their vessels.
